5 Highlights: Massachusetts State Budget for Fiscal Year 2023

We have a budget! Massachusetts was the last state in the country to file a budget for Fiscal Year (FY) 2023.

The Commonwealth's FY 2023 budget represents an increase of about \$5 billion – or 10.7% – over the previous year, including increases for multiple early, elementary/secondary, and post-secondary education funding streams.

Here are five highlights from this year's budget:

The budget includes nearly \$6 billion in state funding for districts and schools – \$485 million more than last year. This increase represents the second year of implementation of the Student Opportunity Act (SOA), which changed the state's school funding formula, known as Chapter 70. In addition, the budget includes \$15 million for scholarship and loan repayment programs to help diversify the educator workforce.



The FY23 budget increases funding for early education and care,

bringing the state closer to implementing several of the Special Legislative Early Education and Care Economic Review Commission's recommendations. This year's investments include:

- \$250 million in Commonwealth Cares for Children stabilization grants,
- \$175 million for a new High-Quality Education and Care Affordability Fund,
- \$60 million for a rate reserve to increase salaries for teachers and others at subsidized providers, and
- \$31.5 million in grants to Head Start programs across the state.

The budget reflects a commitment to higher education students by increasing the Community College SUCCESS Fund to \$14 million (\$3.5 million more than last year's budget) and investing \$175.1 million in the State Scholarship Program — \$44.6 million more than last year.

This budget commits to providing free school meals for all students next school year, regardless of whether the federal government extends this pandemic-era program. The state is investing \$110 million to ensure all students can receive free meals in school.



The budget increases investments in Early College to \$19 million — \$8 million more than last year's budget.

The Fiscal year 2023 budget includes **\$52.7 Billion** in spending.
