







# POLICIES THAT DRIVE RESULTS


**1. College and Career Advising:** Students do best when they have guidance early and often as they plan for life after high school. Districts must ensure every student has consistent support to explore future opportunities, choose courses aligned to their goals, and prepare for college and careers.

**2. Access to Advanced Courses:** Advanced courses build in-demand skills and provide access to college credit. District policy can expand options for advanced courses and ensure all students who are prepared for the coursework are automatically enrolled in these opportunities in core high school subjects.

**3. High-Quality Career and Technical Education (CTE):** Every student should have access to a diverse set of high-quality pathways aligned to meaningful postsecondary opportunities that lead to a living wage. Codifying this commitment through board policy ensures these pathways are sustained, regularly evaluated, and aligned to proven student outcomes.

**4. Aligning College and Career Goals to District Resources:** Clear, ambitious college and career goals keep the district focused on strategies that lead to results for all students and allow the public to track progress over time. Aligning budget decisions to these goals ensures resources are invested transparently and accountably in the strategies that best support student success.

**5. Reinvestment in Student Readiness:** State funds tied to student success after graduation should be reinvested where they matter most. Committing to reinvest 90% of these funds maintains progress and expands access to effective college and career preparation.
