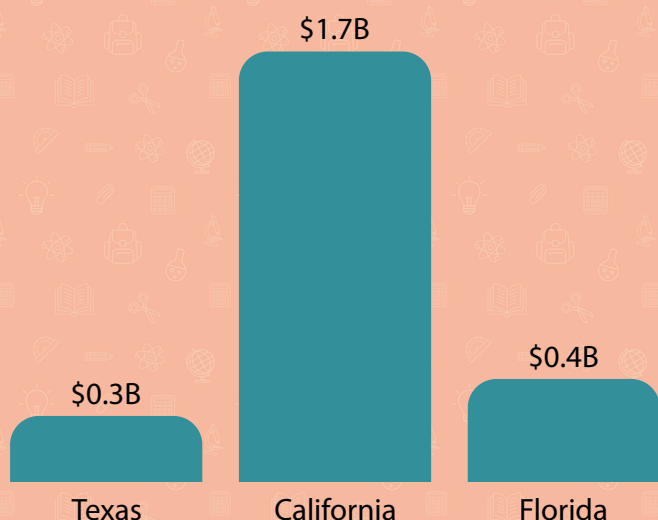


What Happens When Grad PLUS Loans Disappear in Texas?

Texas students and institutions rely on an average of \$260.3 million in Grad PLUS borrowing to cover costs that exceed federal borrowing limits. However, beginning July 1, changes to federal graduate loan policy will limit access to this critical source of financing for many borrowers.

Who Stands to Lose the Most From Grad PLUS Changes?

Grad PLUS borrowing in Texas is concentrated among both private not-for-profit and public institutions, reflecting the central role that public and not-for-profit universities play in driving graduate loan demand.

Minority Serving Institution's receive significant Grad PLUS funding in Texas, indicating that elimination would fall disproportionately on students of color and institutions serving historically underrepresented communities.
